# Flashes of Light

A family home makes creative use of LED lights and acrylic panels for a stunning take on minimal design

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Cool, calm, bright and breezy – the perfect respite from the scorching desert sun and a combination that has transformed this five-bedroom open-plan Palm Jumeirah family home into a design masterpiece. When the homeowner approached Julie Doran of Elemento Interior Design about a complete renovation of his villa – including new furnishings – he asked her to create a sleek, modern home for him, his wife and their five-year-old son.

“When I first arrived at the house, the rear space downstairs had already been opened to create a large area with a panoramic view of the sea,” says Julie. “I visualised a scheme that allowed the eye to wander from one well-designed area smoothly to the next by focusing on two basic concepts: openness and visual stimulation.” To achieve aesthetic appeal while maintaining the uncluttered sleek appearance the homeowners desired, creative use of lighting was of paramount importance. lamps and standing lights would have made the home look too fussy and interrupted its sleek and modern aesthetic, so Julie used panelled lighting in the walls instead – incorporating LED lights and acrylic panels. This feature, present throughout the property, is one of its most striking design elements.

Julie's next challenge was to choose furnishings that complemented the villa's minimal scheme while creating a warm, family-friendly feel. To establish a more homely environment, Julie used stylish bespoke furniture in warm neutral tones, incorporating fabric from UK-based textile company Zinc. But there was one exception to this subtle scheme. "The client had confided in me that his wife had a special attraction to the colour purple, so within the basically neutral scheme, I introduced purple into the dining room chairs to quite a dramatic effect."

Creating a divide between the kitchen and the living area of the open-plan main floor is an impressive, illuminated library shelving unit. ▶

"To further enhance its impact, additional pieces were introduced and I think these accessories provide additional drama, balance and further visual interest," says Julie. "Every element in this spacious living area is serene, and although beautiful in their own right, they do not detract from the impressive view."

The most outstanding feature is the marble and glass staircase that Julie says was created from the original, much smaller and less impressive structure. "This staircase flows towards the bedrooms and, most notably, the master bedroom, which now has the same panels and lighting as the areas below."

When the project was complete, any feelings of nervousness Julie might have had about the homeowner's reaction were dispelled when they toured the space. "The look of sheer wonder and delight showed me that they loved their new home." ■
